## COUNT II - CIVIL RIGHTS

- 32. The Plaintiff repeats and incorporates paragraphs 1-31 above.
- 33. The Defendant violated the Plaintiff's Civil Rights by imposing sanctions against her "based on sex," in a disparate manner and with deliberate indifference as to her rights, and imposed sanctions against her "based on sex" more severe than sanctions imposed on male students who committed worse offenses.
- 34. As a result, the Plaintiff has suffered and will continue to suffer a violation of her Civil Rights.

## COUNT III – STATE TORT CLAIMS ACT (emotional distress)

- 35. The Plaintiff repeats and incorporates paragraphs 1-34 above.
- 36. The Defendant originally caused the Plaintiff to suffer severe emotional distress by the imposition of sanctions and public shame and humiliation, without legal justification or authority.
  - 37. As a result, the Plaintiff has suffered and will continue to suffer emotional distress.

## COUNT IV - PROCEDURAL DUE PROCESS

- 38. The Plaintiff repeats and incorporates paragraphs 1-37 above.
- 39. The Defendant violated the Plaintiff's rights by imposing sanctions without compliance with procedural due process in the nature of a meaningful hearing or by applying the standards set forth in the school's own disciplinary policies.
- 40. As a result, the Plaintiff has suffered and will continue to suffer a violation of her rights.

## RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Pursuant to G.L.c.218, §19 and 19C, Plaintiff respectfully seeks judgment in her favor, and requests the following:

1. Issue a temporary restraining order immediately reinstating the Plaintiff's captaincy and vacating the sanctions against her so that she can play with her team on October. 11, 2013;
